



Hermes had also carried the message to Zeus's brother, the mighty Poseidon, god of the sea.



The Olympic Games were held every four years at the site of Olympia and included contests in which ancient Greek athletes would compete.

Because these games were part of a religious festival to honor the king of the gods, Zeus, they were considered sacred. In the first Olympic Games, there were only footraces, or running races. Later came events like wrestling, boxing, racing horses and chariots, throwing the heavy stone discus, and throwing the javelin, a type of long spear.
