Vocabulary Reference Sheet

- burrow to tunnel or dig down into something.
   ACT IT OUT: Use your hands to pretend you are digging into the mitten.
- admire To look upon something with love, wonder, or pleasure.
   ACT IT OUT: Pretend you are looking at something you love, like a cute puppy or a beautiful flower.
- jostle To bump, push, or shove, roughly and rudely.

VISUALIZE IT: Imagine that you are in a big crowd, and everyone is pushing, shoving, and jostling to get through.

talons - A bird's claws.

ACT IT OUT: Curl your index finger to make it look like the owl's claw, or talon.

drowsy - tired; sleepy

VISUALIZE IT: Think of a time when you were so fired and drowsy, you felt like you couldn't stay awake.

- lumber To move heavily or clumsily.ACT IT OUT: walk around the room the way a bear would lumber.
- scatter to separate and go off in many different directions.

ACT IT OUT: Pretend that you are a farmer, scattering seeds on the ground.


