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How Can We Make a Difference?: Project Checklist

- Complete the project plan for your team.

During:

- Document your project through photos and videos.
- Gather data to use when sharing the impact of your project. This data can include:
 - Quantitative data (Examples: How many people did you help? How much money did you raise? How many items did you collect?)
 - Qualitative data (Examples: Interviews with volunteers or people affected; written descriptions of the event as it happens)

After:

• Thank those who were involved:

Class Issue PSA Prompt

Task: You have been learning about how kids have taken action to make a difference, and have developed a plan for how you will take action for an issue in your community. Write a script for a PSA urging people to find a way to take action and make a difference in this issue. Other students, parents, and people in your community will listen to your PSA to learn more about the issue and why they should take action to help the community.

Directions: Write a script for a PSA about why someone should take action to make a difference in the issue your class has identified in your community. Be sure to describe the issue and offer some things the audience might do to take action. Choose the most important reasons and include at least one example from your research on kids making a difference to support your opinion. Then write a script that has a clear introduction, a convincing argument about the importance of taking action on this issue, and a conclusion.

The PSA should:

- Be a high-quality product so people trust it
- Describe the issue
- Describe the impact of the issue
- Suggest some possible solutions/action people can take
- Be engaging so that people remember the information and want to take action
- Be no more than 2 minutes long when read aloud

REMEMBER: A well-written opinion text:

- Gives the reader information needed to understand the topic and clearly states the focus
- Gives reasons for the opinion that are supported by facts and details
- Follows rules of writing (spelling, punctuation, and grammar)

Model PSA

Issue: Hunger
