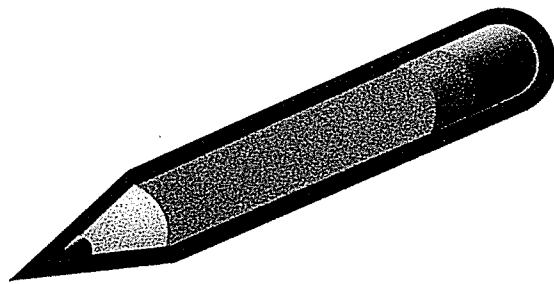

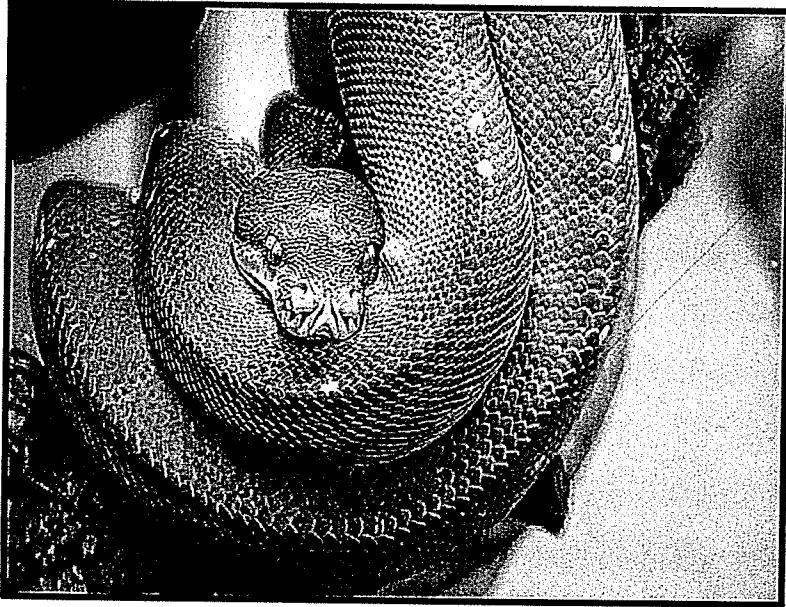

SNAKES



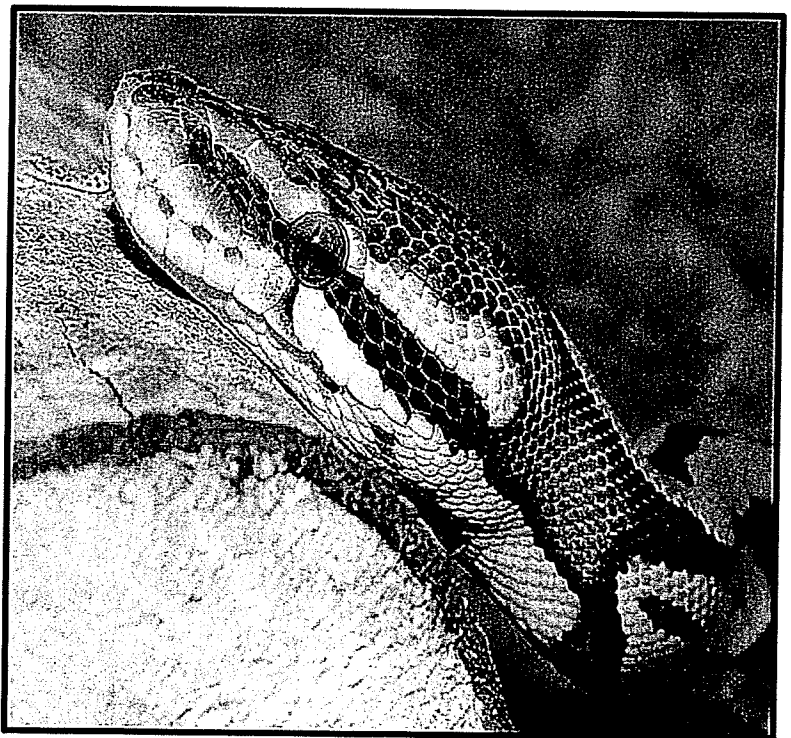
There are more than 3,000 species of snakes in the world and there is at least one type of snake on every continent except Antarctica. With so many different species, there are snakes of many different sizes. The world's smallest snake is the Thread snake,

which grows to only about 4 inches long. It looks much like an earthworm. The largest snake, the Reticulated Python, can grow to a whopping 30 feet. The largest snake **fossil** ever discovered is called the Titanoboa. This creature lived 60 million years ago and would have been 50 feet long!

Snakes are **carnivores**. This means that they only eat meat. Snakes are often seen as pests, but they actually can help the planet by eating **rodents**. Most snakes simply swallow their prey whole. Large snakes, such as the python, will strangle their prey to death and *then* swallow it whole.

WOLVES



Wolves are wild dogs that come from the same group as the dingo and coyote. They live and hunt in groups called **packs**. A pack can range from two wolves to as many as 20 wolves. Most packs have one breeding pair of wolves, called the alpha pair, who lead the hunt. When the

called the alpha pair, who lead the hunt. When the pack kills an animal, the alpha pair always eats first. Wolves have to travel to find food. They don't find food everyday so they will eat up to 30 pounds at a time to make up for days of missed food.

Wolves use body **language** to show other wolves how they feel about things. To show anger a wolf may stick its ears straight up and **bare** its teeth. When a wolf is afraid it may flatten its ears against its head. Pack members will howl together to defend their **territory**.

CROCODILES




Crocodiles are the largest **reptiles**. Reptiles have two special features; they are cold-blooded and are usually covered in scales. Crocodiles have a hard scaly skin, a long tail, short legs and very sharp teeth. There are freshwater crocodiles and saltwater crocodiles. Freshwater crocodiles are smaller and every tooth is the same size. Meanwhile, saltwater crocodiles are bigger, have teeth of different sizes and are more dangerous to humans.


In water crocodiles are hidden and the only thing you'll see are the eyes and nostrils. This way they can breathe more easily and catch **prey** coming to the water to get a drink. They swim very well with the help of their long and powerful tail. On the ground the crocodiles like to **sunbathe** with their mouths open and also make their nests.

FAST FACT: Crocodiles can be seen with their jaws wide open. They do this to cool themselves because they don't have sweat **glands**.

SEA TURTLES

Sea turtles live in oceans all over the world except the Arctic Ocean. Those waters are too cold. They prefer swimming in warm seas and stay in **shallow** coastal areas like lagoons and bays, but they are sometimes found in deeper ocean waters as well.





FAST FACT: Unlike land turtles, sea turtles can't hide their heads and legs inside the shell.

Grown sea turtles have very few **predators**. However, baby sea turtles are not so lucky. Mother sea turtles lay lots of eggs on the beach in a hole they dig. Then the mothers leave and go back into the ocean. The eggs are left **defenseless** and become food for many predators. Once the eggs hatch, the **hatchlings** head for the water where they are also at risk.

JELLYFISH

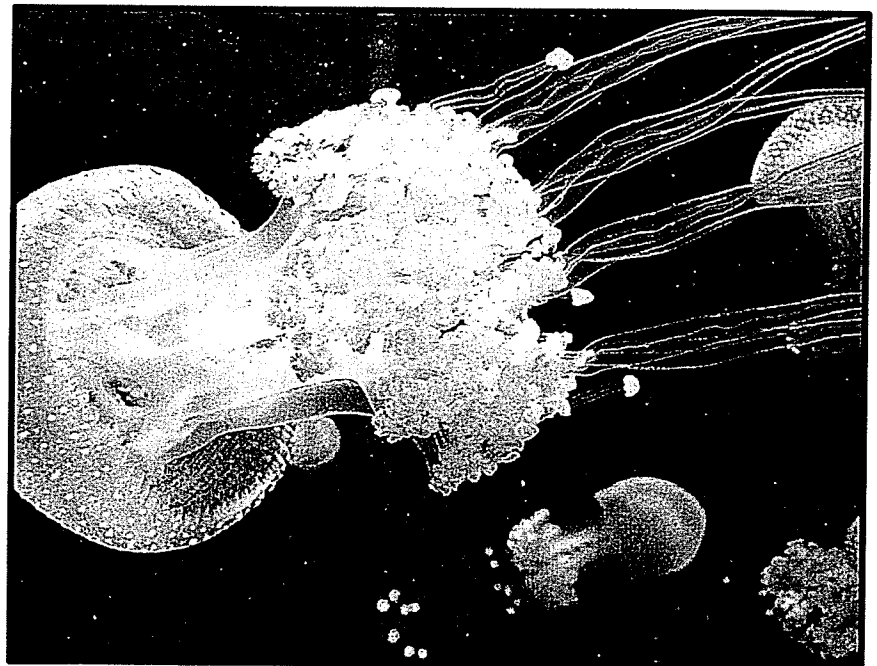


Jellyfish can be found in every ocean of the world, in deep water, and on the **coast**. Tentacles hang down from their smooth baglike body and sting their prey. Jellyfish have tiny stinging cells in their tentacles to stun or **paralyze** their prey before they eat them. Inside their bell-shaped body is an opening that is its mouth.

Jellyfish stings can be painful to humans and sometimes very dangerous. However, jellyfish don't purposely attack humans. Most stings occur when people accidentally touch a jellyfish, but if the sting is from a dangerous species, it can be deadly.



FAST FACT:

Did you know some jellyfish are clear but others are in **vibrant** colors such as pink, yellow, blue, and purple, and often are **luminescent**. Their colors warn predators!



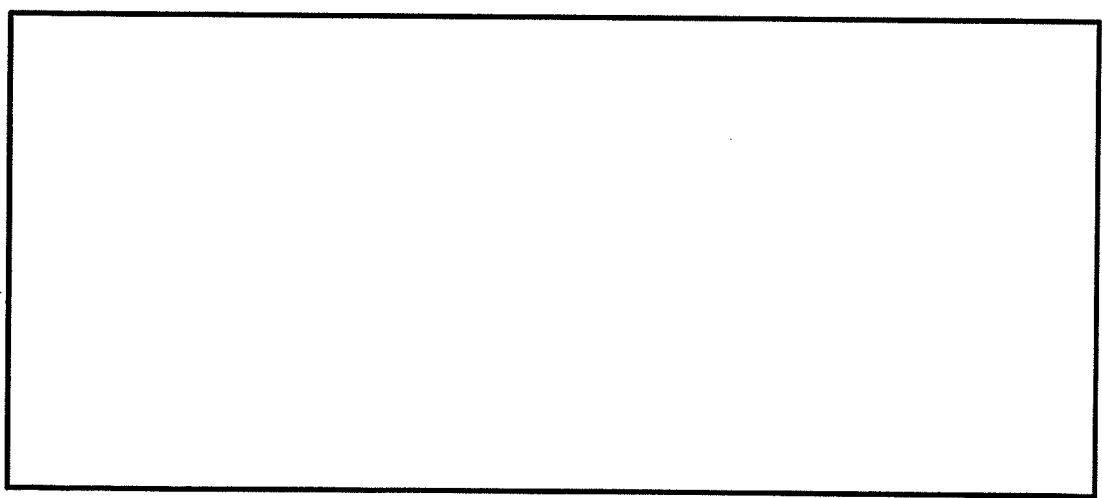
