Birds have different shaped feet, depending on where they live. Birds such as mocking birds, robins and cardinals have perching feet. These birds have three toes in front and one in back, which allows them to grip a perch. The second type of bird has an eagle foot. Birds such as eagles, owls and hawks have sharp talons, which allow them to grip and kill their prey. The webbed foot birds (waterfowl) have webbed shaped feet, allowing them to paddle through water. Ducks, geese and flamingos are birds with webbed shaped feet. Finally, the ostrich (ostrich foot) is the only bird with two toes, which allows these flightless birds to run very fast.





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

What is a platypus? It is an odd animal. In some ways, it is like a bird. In some ways, it is like a reptle. In some ways, it is like a mammal.

Platypus only live in one small area of Australia. Scientists in Europe didn't see one until 1800. Some thought the cnimal, no longer living, was a trick. They tried to pull its bill off. One scientist studied the platypus carefully. He decided it is a mammal.

The platypus has a bill like a duck and webbed feet like some birds that live on the water. It was given a name that means "flat-footed duck." The platypus even lays eggs like a bird, but it is not a bird.

Platypus eggs have a leathery shell, like reptile eggs. Like many reptiles, the baby platypus is born with a special tooth. This "egg tooth" helps it break out of its shell. The platypus is also like a reptile because it has a venomous spike on its back leg. Many reptiles are venomous.

The platypus is not a bird or a reptile. It is a mammal! It has fur covering most of its body. It feeds milk to its young, and it is warm-blooded. These are all **traits** of mammals.
