# Overview - ESSER

## Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief Programs

Under ESSER, established by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (2020), further funded under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act 2021 and the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act of 2021, the U.S. Department of Education awarded emergency relief funds to address the impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had and continues to have on schools.

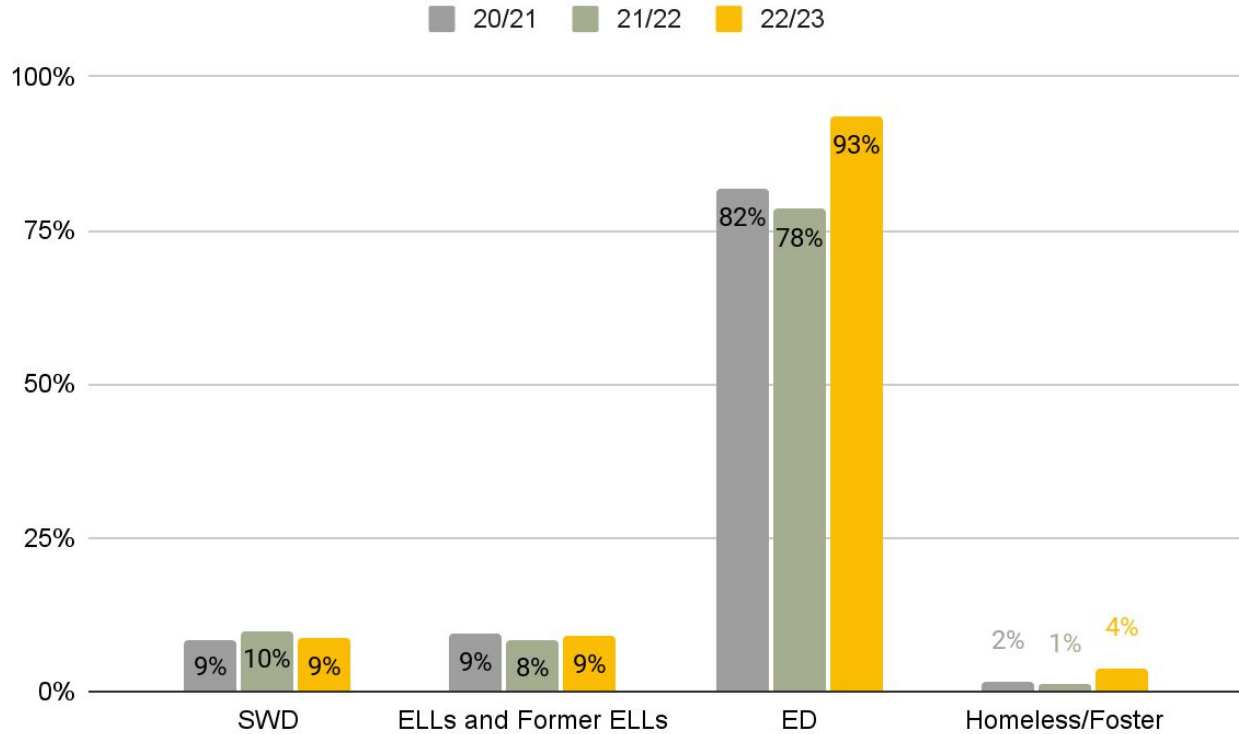
## Fund's Purpose

- to safely reopen schools
- maximize in-person instructional time for all students
- provide opportunities to address the impacts of lost instructional time resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic
- address diverse needs arising from or exacerbated by COVID-19 pandemic, including social, emotional, mental health and academic needs

## Take in Consideration How to Address Inequities

- including focusing supports and services on students from low-income families, students of color, students with disabilities, English learners, students experiencing homelessness, children and youth in foster care, migratory students, children who are incarcerated, and other underserved students who have been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic
